Spanish 1 Credit Recovery

Credit Recovery - Make Up Courses

A diagnostic driven credit recovery course is designed to give an expanded opportunity for students who did not succeed the first time in the course. Students are given the opportunity in each learning unit to demonstrate their knowledge in that area of study. If they demonstrate competency in their unit assessment they will be presented with the following unit. If they do not demonstrate competency then they are required to do the entire unit.

Requirement: For a student to take a credit recovery course, they must have already taken the class unsuccessfully and have the appropriate seat time.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course provides students with instruction in the basics of learning the language of Spanish. This includes but is not limited to the vocabulary topics of greetings, time, dates, colors, clothing, numbers and weather. The course also introduces basic verbs and their formation and use in the present tense. Students also learn about interrogatives, question formation, and adjectives and their form and use. Finally, students will become acquainted with the Spanish-speaking countries of the world and their cultures.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- Recognize and use basic Spanish vocabulary.
- Communicate in simple narrative and interrogative situations.
- Recognize and use the present tense structure.
- Form and use adjectives for basic communication.
- Become familiar with the Spanish-speaking countries of the world and the basics of their cultures.
