Global History I CR

A diagnostic driven credit recovery course is designed to give an expanded opportunity for students who did not succeed the first time in the course. Students are given the opportunity in each learning unit to demonstrate their knowledge in that area of study. If they demonstrate competency in their unit assessment they will be presented with the following unit. If they do not demonstrate competency then they are required to successfully complete the entire unit.

Global History I CR is the first part of a two-year chronological study of world history. This part begins with the development of the first civilizations and concludes with the 1770's. It emphasizes geography, interactions over time, shifts in political power, and the role of belief systems.
