Global II (Credit Recovery)

A diagnostic driven credit recovery course is designed to give an expanded opportunity for students who did not succeed the first time in the course.

Students are given the opportunity in each learning unit to demonstrate their knowledge in that area of study. If they demonstrate competency in their unit assessment they will be presented with the following unit. If they do not demonstrate competency then they are required to do the entire unit.

Requirement:

For a student to take a credit recovery course, they must have already taken the class unsuccessfully and have the appropriate seat time.

Prerequisite: Global II (Student must have taken Global II unsuccessfully and have the appropriate seat time).

Course Length: One Semester

Required Materials: World History Patterns of Interaction – McDougal Littell (ISBN-13: 978-0-618-91330-5; ISBN-10: 0-618-91330-0).

Description:

Global History II is the continuation of the chronological study of the world started in Global History I. This course focuses on the period 1750 – present day. Several concepts covered throughout the course include industrialization, nationalism, imperialism, conflict, and the interconnectedness of the world. Students will continue to develop their CRQ and Enduring Issues Essay writing skills.
